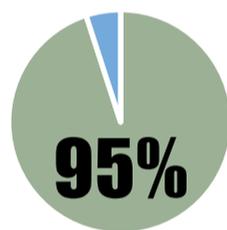

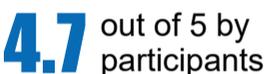
Station House Adjustment Program

students rated their ability to create healthy solutions to life problems

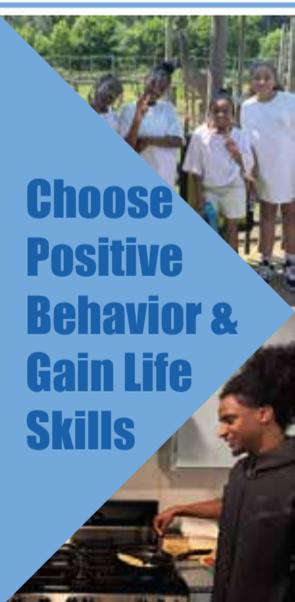
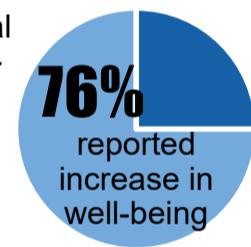

21st CCLC Afterschool Program

served **211** 3rd-8th grade students

Community Youth Centers



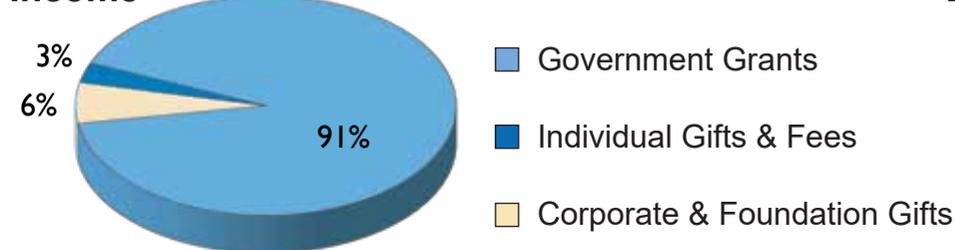

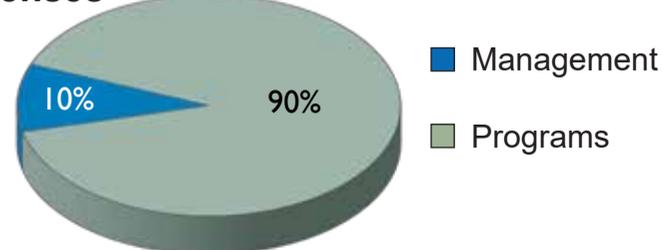
